The MSPFA invites you to exhibit your birds and eggs with us. The Fairground at Frederick is located on East Patrick Street (just off Interstate Rt. 70 and US Route 40).

Directions: The Frederick fairground is located on Rt. 144 which can be reached from I70 or US 40 if coming from the East, West, or South. If coming from the North, follow US 15 to MD 144. Enter the fairgrounds and the show will be held in buildings 13, 14, and 14A. Go around the right side of the buildings for parking and entrance. No parking in front of these buildings as the fairgrounds are used for several functions and the area in front of the buildings may be used for parking for these events

Food: The Fine Feathered Friends 4-H Club from Carroll County will again be providing food (soups, sandwiches, desserts and beverages) for the show. The food stand will be open Friday afternoon/evening, Saturday starting at 7 a.m. with breakfast and continuing through early evening, and Sunday starting at 7 a.m. with breakfast and will close with lunch items around 10:30 a.m.

Camper Hookups: A charge of \$25 per night is assessed by the Frederick Fairground. Please pay at coop in.

Special notes regarding the MSPFA Show:

- o There will be no alcoholic beverages on the fairground.
- o MSPFA will not be responsible for loss or damage to birds or people.
- o Junior exhibitors must show birds they own and care for themselves and must coop birds in themselves.

Motel Information: Days Inn (301-694-6600) is the headquarters for the show. They offer a discount for those exhibiting with us. Be sure to say you are with the MD Poultry Show.

Testing of Birds: All birds must be tested for Pullorum-Typhoid within a year. Maryland birds have to test for Avian Influenza AND all out-of-state exhibits must be tested for Avian Influenza within 10 days of

the show. SALE of untested birds is prohibited. All birds must have an identifying leg band provided by the appropriate state department of agriculture.

Judges for our show are Mr. Tom Roebuck, Unionville, VA; Mr. Mike Wasylkowski, Magnolia, DE, and Brian Decker, Port Deposit, MD

Entries: Entries will close October 20 or when cooping capacity is reached. Entry fees must accompany your entry. Make your check payable to: MSPFA. Mail to Mary Ellen Arbaugh, 2244 Trevanion Rd., Taneytown, MD 21787.

Classes: We offer classes for large fowl, bantams, waterfowl, turkeys, guineas, and eggs.

Entry fee is \$3.00 per bird; \$3.00 entry fee for egg entry consisting of 3 eggs

Double coops (for large fowl only) are \$6.00

“Clean up” fee of \$1.00 is assessed for each exhibitor

Fill out a show so if you wish to contribute to assist in defraying your entry form.

Schedule of Events:

All birds must be cooped in by 9 a.m., Saturday, November 5. For your convenience, the show hall will be open about 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Friday, November 4.

Judging will begin at 9 a.m. and continue until completed.

The Show will end on Sunday, November 6 around 10 a.m. OR immediately following the announcements of winners of the ~~Look for~~ raffle, the Chinese Raffle and a short awards ceremony.

Junior Show: Be sure to indicate on the entry form if you are showing as a junior. We will also be conducting a Junior Showmanship Contest on Saturday morning beginning at 10 a.m. We encourage all junior exhibitors to participate in this activity. You may sign up for the Showmanship Contest at the show.

Egg Show: Eggs will be evaluated on exterior qualities – uniform in size, color, shape. Exhibit consists of three eggs – may be brown, white, colored, bantam, pigeon, other. Entry fee is \$3. Premium is \$10 for best entry if there are a minimum of 4 entries in each class; \$20 if there are 10 or more entries in each class. **(P.S. Everyone takes pride in their poultry hobby so perhaps you’d consider donating a fertile-egg entry to the Silent Auction or Chinese Raffle to encourage others to also enjoy your hobby. If this idea appeals to you, let us know at coop in.)**

“Who Jumped The Fence”: For those who have birds of questionable parentage, we also offer a fun class – “Who Jumped The Fence”. This fun class is open to all healthy birds. **There will be certificates offered for the Prettiest, Oddest, and Most Unusual entries.** The entry fee is the same as for the regular classes. Be sure to include these birds on your entry blank as “Who Jumped The Fence” and indicate whether large fowl, bantam, waterfowl, guinea, or turkey.

Chinese Raffle: We will have our usual raffle of wild, weird, and wacky and WONDERFUL items on Sunday at 9 a.m. This is an attempt to raise funds to help defray the cost of our show. If you have items you would like to donate, the Livezey Family will gladly take your donations.

Silent Auction: If we have interest, and you are interested in offering quality pairs or trios of your purebred birds for the silent auction, please feel free to contact us so we can have the coops ready to display your offering. The bids will close at approximately 9 a.m. +/- on Sunday morning. **Vendor Space (inside the buildings):** Spaces will be 10' x 10' and will include 1 table and 2 chairs at a cost of \$35 each. If you require extra tables, they are available for \$15 each. Vendor space rentals are due at the same time as entries (October 20) and please indicate your vendor space rental on the vendor form.

Swap Meet: An expanded swap/sale area will be held outside the show buildings in the parking lot behind the buildings. Your sale space will be \$15 which will be collected on Saturday morning.
